Pontesbury Parish Council

The Parish Council meeting in June was held at Cruckton Village Hall and Police Inspector Ben Tanfield was in attendance to answer parish councillor questions and concerns about the reduction in Police Community Support Officer cover. A new councillor Sarah Wallace-Johnson was co-opted for the Pontesbury ward. Sarah feels strongly that parish councils are a great way to be more involved with matters that are important on a local level. Sarah worked in museums for most of her career as a Natural Sciences Conservator and now volunteers for several wildlife organisations in the area such as Natural England, The Friends of Pontesbury Hill & The Stepping Stones Project. Recently Sarah has taken up the position of Project Coordinator for the Middle Marches Community Land Trust's Minsterley Meadows project. Sarah is keen to be involved with the Green Recovery Strategy for Shropshire and believes that parish councils can have a hand in the implementation of some of the actions arising from this, empowering local communities to make a difference to their environment. Sarah has previously been a councillor in the village of Rampton in Cambridgeshire, where she used to live and is now also a parish councillor in Minsterley.

June is also the month when councillors sign off the accounts from the previous financial year and submit these accounts to the external auditor, PKF Littlejohn. No issues were raised and the Audit return was submitted. Any elector can view the accounts by contacting the Responsible Financial Officer for the council on finance@pontesbury-pc.gov.uk.

The councillors also agreed to look for quotes to begin replacing the concrete poles for certain streetlights, replace certain pieces of play equipment and for upgrading the public toilets. The biennial tree inspection and survey will also take place later in the summer. Councillors approved a grant to the community of Plealey to supplement monies raised locally to install a defibrillator in the village.



The council have had some positive feedback from residents pleased with the refurbishment of the bus shelter at the top of Hall Bank. A big thank you to Nigel Pugh who was contracted to carry out the works.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Monday 14th July at 6.30pm at Habberley Village Hall.

SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL REPORT BY CII'R NICK HIGNETT.

The new Shropshire Council Administration was formed at the meeting on 22nd May, with Councillor Heather Kidd elected as the new leader of Shropshire Council.

Induction training is now being given to all Councillors, essential to enable us to undertake our duties in a professional and correct manner. This is particularly important for the 50 new Councillors.

The next Shropshire Full Council meeting will be held on 17th July, when the aims and policies of the new administration will become clearer.

A key focus will be on dealing with a budget overspend, which is forecast to continue, in part driven by the ever-rising costs of Adult and Children's Social Care.

West Shropshire Flower Club

Jane Furey's (Cowen) demonstration 'Animal Magic' focused on her favourite British animals. Her first arrangement gave a naturalistic interpretation of a hedgerow, mimicking natural growth within a framework of birch and hazel were groupings of dianthus, white allium and campanula, along with a small hedgehog she had fashioned from the bristles of a stiff brush. She used a straw collar to support a grouped handtied dormouse inspired arrangement. A grouped handtied is a modern, compact, stylish design that emphasizes the flowers by grouping them, using fabulous brown roses, cream hypericum berries, seed pods and eryngium as a thistle. To support the flowers in a foam free arrangement she used a framework of wedged contorted hazel pieces, into which were placed green alstroemeria and orange roses in a natural posy like design. The butterfly creation was a contemporary arrangement, with central willow uprights surrounded by tiers of snap -dragons, calla lilies, double pink peonies and astilbe, and used medalino stick hoops to create space and enclosure. Her 'bee' design was arranged in a vegetative style, mimicking the natural growth of plants, creating a wild, untamed

look rather than a perfectly symmetrical arrangement, and using purple flowers (the bees favourite colour) with alliums, stocks and clematis. Using a ring of moss and twigs as a contemporary river bank, test tubes supported orchids within a tangle of jasmine, and in the middle she placed a small bowl of water with a very

tongue in cheek small plastic duck.





NATURAL ENGLAND Notes from the hill

July is the traditional time for haymaking on and around the Stiperstones although this is always very weather dependant, and in our case is complicated by other factors such as whether there are any nesting birds such as curlews around

There are a couple of places left on the Intro duction to Scything Course on the 27th July and this year we are hoping to hold the first ever bracken scything competition on the 1st August. Between these two dates we have a week of scything both bracken and grass for any volunteers proficient at using a scythe.

Bracken is becoming an increasing problem in upland areas for a variety of reasons. Farmers and commoners would have once harvested this resource to provide bedding for animals instead of straw and this would have limited its spread. Until recently it could be controlled through a specific herbicide, but that option is no longer available. To make matters worse warmer winters and increased airborne nitrogen is favouring its growth and spread. Much of the bracken on the Stiperstones is on steep rocky slopes and above heather which makes it almost impossible to control, so the more people we can encourage to cut it with scythes the better.

Scything, particularly with Austrian scythes is a very enjoyable pastime and as Levin said to his brother, after a day's mowing, in Tolstoy's Anna Karenina, "You can't imagine what an effectual remedy it is for every sort of foolishness."


