The Parish Council meeting in May was the Annual Council Meeting where councillors signed up to sit on various committees and take on specific responsibilities. This May the Annual Council Meeting followed local council elections and so the new Council begins its 4-year term in office. Councillors voted unanimously for Cllr Duncan Fletcher to remain as Chairman and Cllrs Hignett and Trow to remain as Vice-Chairs. Cllr Fletcher thanked all councillors for their Declarations of Acceptance of Office and for committing to support local residents for the new term. Cllr Fletcher also congratulated Cllrs Roger Evans and Nick Hignett on being re-elected as Shropshire Councillors for Longden and Rea Valley areas respectively.

NATURAL ENGLAND— Notes from the hill

Well, what an amazing spring we have had and generally the wildife has benefitted from it, with good insect numbers and lots of caterpillars for birds to be feeding their young with. Cuckoos seem to be doing very well on the Stiperstones, although it would be interesting to see if anyone has heard any away from the nature reserves in the area, as I don't think that I have.

Stonechats have full broods of young already on the wing, these will be the birds that remained on the hill all year and so start nesting early. Ravens also nest early and their young have fledged too. Other more migratory species will be settling down to lay eggs, such as the pied flycatchers and redstarts, the former greatly helped by the nest box schemes being run in the area.

Cuckoos are attracted to the Stiperstones for two main reasons, the abundance of small birds in whose nest they can lay their eggs and the profusion of large caterpillars, which are one of their main food sources. One of the large caterpillars that can be seen at this time of year is the oak eggar moth. This is a large brown day flying moth and the caterpillars feed on a variety of woody plant including heathers and bilberry, but also hawthorn and bramble. Another moth with a large hairy caterpillar is the fox moth which can also be seen during the day. The caterpillars are protected to some extent by their hairy bodies which make them less palatable, however some birds like the cuckoo specialise in eating them and have enveloped a technique of eating them without ingesting their often toxic hairs.

We are still in the peak of our ground nesting bird season so please help them by keeping to paths with dogs on a lead. The other way to help us at present, especially in this dry weather, is to ensure that there are no potential causes of a fire. Fires in the summer can be devastating for wildlife and can be caused by a variety of factors including discarded cigarettes, glass bottles, camping stoves and barbeques. Please keep a look out and ring the emergency services if a fire is suspected.

We are also running a new easy access storytelling walk for those with limited mobility on Friday 6 June 11am-

12.30pm. A free event but requires booking via eventbrite, see QR code.

We will also be celebrating the extended National Nature Reserve in August with a walk led by some of the managers of the site. Details can be found on our events page on Eventbrite.

Rea Valley Community Wildlife Group

April and May have been busy for the Rea Valley

Community Wildlife Group - three fully booked events, two monthly walks and one community event. We'd like to start by thanking the Friends of Pontesford and Earl's Hill for our joint 'Wildflower Walk' at the base of Earl's Hill. Led by local botanist Kat Edwards-White, 15 people enjoyed learning about the wildflowers and botanical highlights of this well-loved local nature reserve. Our Bat Walks, led by ecologist Ben Holloway, have proved to be incredibly popular with participants given hands on experience using electronic bat detectors to listen to the bats use their echolocation as they flew overhead.

Our two monthly walks at Brockton and Poles Coppice were well attended and show that the enthusiasm for nature and wildlife in general is quite high in the Rea Valley area. These walks are free to attend, and no booking is required, a meeting place is listed, and people are encouraged to join in as little or as much as they want. The idea is to share our knowledge and enthusiasm with each other as we explore our surrounding habitats.

We also want to thank Clive and Gill Whitall for inviting us to the 'Go Wild in Worthen' event which was, by all accounts, a resounding success. Many different organisations and groups came together to share our passion for nature with the local community. With prizes and competitions, tea, and cakes and plenty of activities for everyone it was a lovely event, and we look forward to attending next year!











Pontesbury WI met on the 19th May when we welcomed representatives from Mary's Meals. Hannah and Andrew told us how Magnus Macfarlane - Barrow established a charity that

developed from a shed which eventually fed over two million children. This truly inspirational story about how people were encouraged to volunteer, and help in their community, to come together to feed and educate starving children.

At the start they provided 200 meals for children in one country, they now provide 2.6 million children with a meal and education in 16 different countries . It was amazing to learn that for £19.15 Mary's Meals can feed a child for a year.

It was such a moving and inspirational story. Next month the WI are going on a trip for Afternoon tea at Merton Gardens Bicton. Our June meeting will be on June 9th at 2 o'clock we're Caroline Wright will be talking to us about Lilly Chitty. April 2025 brings us to the end of another four year election cycle and I would like to say a big thank you to all of the councillors who have served during this time and been committed and hardworking, with a shared ideology of serving our community. A number of our councillors are standing down, Cllrs Heywood, Lewis, Mac-

kenzie-Slight and Manning. They have been valuable members of the parish team. A particular thank you goes to Cllr Lewis whose tireless support over many decades for myself as Chair, his contribution to many council activities and as our Tree Warden, has been invaluable. I wish all of the Cllrs who are leaving the council at the end of the 24-25 year and send them best wishes for the future.

Thanks as always to our experienced staff team of Clerk, Deputy Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer all having worked in the Town & Parish Council sector for more than five years. Thanks also to Anna, much-loved and hardworking public face of The Pavilion. Please see the separate report on the continuing success of this well-used community building.

The Council team have worked hard during 24-25, as in other years, to maintain essential community services such as streetlights, public toilets, the play area, and public open spaces in the village including. This hasn't always been easy especially with the vandalism to the play area and toilets that we have experienced this year. All of the SOX streetlights have now been converted to LED which has already saved us money in energy used and maintenance costs. A big thank you also goes to Nicola Young (Deputy Clerk) for her hard work in bringing to fruition the complex project to install solar panels on the Pavilion roof. This generation of renewable energy, helps the council and community along the journey to reduce our carbon emissions.

Highlights of the year for me have been the continued partnership working to bring about benefits for the community such as: working with the Pontesbury Climate Emergency Action Group to provide a community garden and orchard; working with adjoining parishes on combatting speeding; the local policing team, Shropshire Library Serivce/Friends Of Pontesbury Library to enable the continuation of the community library and working with Pontesbury Sports Association to update the much loved sports pavilion.



The newly formed Facilities Working Group continue to work on the refurbishment of the public toilets and play area, as well as organising the refresh of the bus shelter at the top of Hall Bank,. They are gradually reviewing all of the council assets. A new noticeboard was purchased and installed in Habberley and a new noticeboard for Lea Cross is on its way. We are also working with local groups to expand the number of defibrillators available in the parish and to update training on their use for local volunteers.


2025 will see our biennial tree inspection survey for the parish to ensure that all trees on land the parish council are responsible for, thrive and are not in danger of falling or losing branches. We are monitoring the trees for ash die-back. We see some evidence of this beginning and so a plan will be put in place to replace those trees over the forthcoming years..

The council has set up a Biodiversity Working Group of councillors and local residents who will be looking at projects to increase biodiversity throughout the parish. They are hoping to form a 'cluster' with neighbouring parishes to enable wildlife corridors to extend between the villages. We are part of a national research project with Exeter University to highlight the impact working at parish council level can have to combat loss of important species of flora and fauna.

Pontesbury Pavilion Community Hub & Library has had another great year during 2024-2025 Financial Year and is continually building on a great reputation and good facilities. This is thanks to the Pavilion Committee and staff team who manage the building. Looking forward to 2025, we already have events booked in and the building is also part of the Pontesbury Festival on Friday, Saturday & Sunday 27th - 29th June 2025.

Day-to-Day Running of the Pavilion. The staff team work to the ethos that "Community is the foundation to success" as quoted by Kristen Jones, and work together to continually refresh, maintain and provide a safe environment. Anna Lawson, Building Assistant and the face of the Pavilion, is the person who greets you upon arrival, she takes your bookings, and sets spaces up - Anna is the backbone of the Pavilion and is there every day to keep the building 'wheels' turning - it's thanks to Anna that everyday is a community day in the Pavilion. Nicki Young, Deputy Clerk & Pavilion Building Manager, keeps those 'wheels' turning behind the scenes. Along with the Pavilion Committee, Nicki works to provide a strategic outlook for the Pavilion, applying for funding, keeping H&S up to date, and providing the link between the community and Council.

The Pavilion is now a vibrant community building thanks to the many different and varied activities which take place, catering from babies & pre-schoolers to those older in age.

Working with Shropshire Council Property Services Group, the staff team have added Legionella Testing to the existing maintenance programme which continues to keep the building services working safely.

Future of Pontesbury Library The Pavilion Committee met with members of the Shropshire Council Library Service and Estates Team to discuss the future of **Pontesbury Library** and the License to Occupy in the Pavilion. We are pleased to report that the parish council have agreed to pay £15,000 per year (an additional £1,000), including an annual contribution of £4,000 from Friends of Pontesbury Library. An agreement is to be signed by Shropshire Council to continue to pay £5,000 for the Library for the License to Occupy the space within the Pavilion.

The Pavilion Committee oversee the strategic work of the Pavilion, along with receiving reports and quotes for larger projects and making recommendations to full Council in line with Standing Orders and Financial Regulations.

This year the Committee have achieved a successful bid to UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UK SPF) / Worcestershire County Council to install **solar panels** on the roof of the Pavilion and, in addition, the Council approved funds to purchase solar energy batteries to store energy created.



The project to install solar panels involved the Deputy Clerk working to a tight deadline to achieve a great result. Severn Valley Renewables won the contract to install 28 x solar PV cells with micro-inverters, onto the Pavilion roof and 3 batteries sited in the kitchen. All members of SVR and the scaffolding team worked extremely hard to bring the project to completion in time to make the claim. There was great communication from all parties and SVR provided help where needed. This is also followed up by one year support from SVR.

The Council are already reaping the benefits and seeing a reduced use of energy from the grid. A screen in the Bistro Area gives daily updates on the solar energy used and stored.

Since the solar panel project was completed on 14th February 2025, the Pavilion is now 96% electricity self-sufficient, having produced enough solar energy to support daytime use, we have only used 52kWh from the grid. Overall the solar panels have produced 2.58 MWh solar energy, feeding 1.41

MWh into the batteries to support the Pavilion with energy self-sufficiency.

Maintenance—The Meeting Room was **repainted** in March 2025, with quotes sought and a local painter and decorator being successful with their price. We now have a spruced up and made the space brighter for the community.

To save money, the Pavilion Committee also agreed to **purchase a carpet cleaner** rather than regularly hire in a company. This now means that the Building Assistant, along with her other cleaning duties, washes the Pavilion carpets on a more regular basis, this was most beneficial during the winter rainy

Room Hire The Pavilion Committee voted to retain the same hire price for the financial year 2025-2026.

Hiring of the rooms in the Pavilion has been consistent, with a total number of bookings in last Financial Year of 490 compared to the total number of bookings for the current Financial Year decreasing slightly to 487, which includes paid hiring and hiring not paid for, ie, for Council meetings, Council events, Committee meetings. This equates to an average of 40 bookings per month. A total of 26 one-off events were held in the Pavilion during FY 2024-2025, with approximately 476 people attending these events, so the total number of people using the building over the year is quite a considerable number.



This was supported by the Stepping Stones Project and Marches Meadows Group. An information board in the cemetery explains more.

The meadow space now needs more work to help it become a place where meadow plants, insects, birds and mammals can thrive. St George's Church Eco Group is delighted that the **Shropshire Hills**Conservation Fund, run by the Shropshire Hills National Landscape, is supporting us to:

- Cut and remove grass cuttings three times in 2025/26
- · Scarify the land and sow wildflower seed
- Engage with the local community through events and activities to enjoy the site and to learn about the importance of hay meadows for biodiversity

We will be working with Pontesbury Primary School on an art project for the Pontesbury Festival (27th -29th June), and there will be an open air, open-to-all church service in the meadow on Sunday 13th July at 3pm (bring a rug/chair/picnic!).

The Shropshire Hills are a National Landscape (previously known as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty). The purpose of National Landscapes is to reduce risks from climate change and nature depletion, and to improve people's wellbeing. The St George's Meadow project aims to help biodiversity in our cemetery, close to Pontesford Hill. Keep an eye on how the meadow space changes over the year! More

Who is this Mystery Man? Does anyone know who this person is? It is believed the photograph is of Richard Samuel France (the son of Richard France who lived with his family in Plealey. Richard Samuel France died at his friend's house in 1882 (William and Maria Spaull)), at Bryntirion on Morda Road, Oswestry. This photo is still

hanging on the wall at this house! The photograph is also in a house in Bronygarth where apparently the owner's grandfather bought the property from 'a' Mr France, but we do not have the address or owners name of this house.

Millionaire Richard Samuel France owned limestone quarries in Llanymynech and coal mines at Nantmawr; as well as engineering works to produce bridges, locomotives, wagons and construction equipment for railway contractors. He was responsible for building railway lines; including, for example, the Potts line and Abbey Station in Shrewsbury in 1866. Shrewsbury Railway Heritage Trust is also trying to trace his descendants, so anyone named France is welcome to contact them. 




