Rea Valley Transport Scheme

The churches of the Rea Valley have obtained funding to operate a transport scheme to enable residents of the area to access medical appointments including Pontesbury & Worthen surgeries; and Shrewsbury, Telford and Oswestry hospitals.

We hope to launch the scheme in May and to this end, are seeking to recruit a team of volunteer drivers. A volunteer driver must have no more than 3 points on their license, be willing to undertake a DBS check and be willing to transport patients to medical appointments with expenses paid; and provide the Scheme administrator with an email address and telephone number.

No commitment to a particular day or frequency is required. Each time a request is received, the whole team will be contacted and whoever is first to respond will be allocated to the patient. Drivers will not be expected to do any lifting of patients.

There is a briefing meeting at The Pavilion In Pontesbury on Monday 24th March at 7 p.m. for anyone who would like to know more. No commitment will be expected at this meeting: it is for information only.

Shropshire Council Report from Cllr Roger Evans.

Present Shropshire Council issues include:

This year it is being predicted that the council will overspend its agreed budget for 2024-5 by around £35m. Also permission is being sort from government to borrow a further £26m to pay the costs of employing the PwC consultants and meet both the redundancy and other transformation costs. Finally it is being predicted that the General Reserves held by the council will fall again and finish up at just under £4m.

NWRR. At present it is predicted that the full business case of the North West Relief Road (NWRR), showing its updated costs, is to be published and then, if approved will be sent onto Government asking them to substantially increase its financial contribution.

The next issue concerns the updated Local Plan. The nationally appointed planning inspectors have expressed a number of concerns and told the council to make improvements to it. The council admits it is now not able to meet the required 5-year housing target. It is hoping to deliver the required modifications within the next 6 months.

Finally the government has stated that it aims to have Mayors elected and in place covering all of England together with Unitary Councils. These latter ones would be elected by a minimum of 500,00 electors. Shropshire Council at present looks after approximately 260,000 electors, more information is awaited.

The Marches Choir present Puccini's Messa Di Gloria

The Marches Choir are preparing a musical feast with a distinct operatic flavour, to be performed at their upcoming concert on Saturday 5th April at St John's Church, Bishops Castle. Although the main work, the "Messa di Gloria" by Puccini, is a setting of the Mass, it is not specifically liturgical. Rather, like the "Requiem" by Verdi, it uses a highly indulgent, dramatic and passionate musical language not usually found in church music.

The "Messa" abounds in wonderfully uplifting melodies and an exuberant harmonic palette, sometimes subtle, sometimes impassioned, and always engaging for listeners and performers, which include Welsh tenor soloist and rising operatic star, Osian Wyn Bowen, and seasoned operatic bass, Nicholas Morris, who has performed with The Marches Choir on numerous previous occasions.

Other works on the programme include "Grand March" from "Aida" by Verdi, providing a stirring opening to the concert from the combined forces of the Choir and Marches Sinfonia, as well as the heartrendingly beautiful "Au fond du temple saint", the tenor/baritone duet from Bizet's opera "The Pearl Fishers". As always, the inspirational venue of St John's Church in will provide the perfect setting for this music, with its acoustic ringing with the sounds of great music.

NATURAL ENGLAND

Notes from the hill

February and March are a quiet time on the hill for wild-life, particularly as the weather has been cold of late. The Long Mynd have been reporting flocks of golden plover and we usually get some over this way particularly on areas where we have carried out recent heather burns.

March is traditionally the month in which we carry out controlled burning of the heather. This is to give the heath a more varied structure, provide young shoots for the red grouse and to reduce the fuel load in case of a summer wildfire.

Sunday the 6th April is our first event this year, which is for any scythers out there wishing to get their blades in good condition for the coming year. The peening workshop will be at our reserve base from 10am-1pm.

Although we still use some traditional tools like scythes when managing nature reserves we also embrace technology in conservation. We use drones to carry out aerial photography allowing us to monitor things like the extent of bracken and gorse or management practices like the burning and cutting of the heather. Recently the use of thermal imagery from drones has given us a much better idea of how many deer and also used to spot nesting birds such as curlew. Unfortunately there is still a huge problem with drainage which has prevented the Football from taking place every week but we are working hard with The Parish Council - Cllrs Fletcher, Lewis & Hignett to find a solution.

We would like to thank Matthew Dorricott (excavation man), The Parish Council, Good Neighbours, Wickes and everyone who has organised and attended our fund-raising events - we still have a long way to go to complete 'The Vision' but we are on the right track.

Rea Valley Community Wildlife Group

Celebrating wildlife in Pontesbury; Minsterley, Pulverbatch, Stiperstones and the Hope Valley Areas.

The Rea Valley Community Wildlife Group (RVCWG) met for our inaugural monthly wildlife walk. After a friendly introduction we set out to explore around the Lead Mines at Snailbeach – an interesting site managed by the Shropshire Mines Trust. Continuing up along the top of the Hollies Nature Reserve to Blakemoorgate cottages at Stiperstones then circling back down through Resting hill wood to the start point at Snailbeach.

Highlights of fungi including collared earthstar; black earth-tongues, witches' butter, turkey-tail and scarlet elf cup, and giant puff ball as well as liverworts, lichens, and mosses such as: white earwort (a first iRecord in our area); ciliated fringewort, dog lichen and big shaggy moss! For the botanists among us – seeing spurge-laurel in flower was a lovely highlight. The non-botanist among us saw plenty of birds including raven, jay, nuthatch, blue and great tits. Towards the end of the walk most of us were happy to glimpse a fox at the top of the hill. A successful walk for a cold January day!

Each walk is free to attend, and no booking required. The next walk takes place Saturday 22nd March at Gatton Daffodil Car Park.

Joining the RVCWG is free and open to anyone who lives or works in the area and has an active interest in nature. We have botanists and birders, moth and butterfly fanatics, reptile and mammal lovers and general natural history enthusiasts. 




