

Pontesbury Parish Council

At the Parish Council meeting in April, Councillors approved recommendations from the Facilities Working Group about refurbishing the bus stop at the top of Hall Bank; a new parish noticeboard for Lea Cross and support for all areas, in the purchasing and installation of defibrillators to improve coverage. Once the new defibrillator in Plealey is in place there will be some defibrillator training held in the parish. If you would be interested in taking part, please contact clerk@pontesburypc.org.uk.

'Bins for boys'. This is a scheme by Lingen Davies to increase facilities across Shropshire for men with stomas. The parish council have installed a bin in the men's toilet on School Green and been added to the Lingen Davies 'Bins for boys' map of available facilities.

The Council also set up a Biodiversity Working Group which will include Councillors and local residents. There has already been a lot of activity to increase biodiversity in the parish including the wildflower verges along the cycleway, tree & hedge planting, lot of talks on relevant subjects and conservation activities. Local residents and councillors raised their concerns about the delayed improvements to the junctions on Hall Bank. The Parish Clerk and Cllr Nick Hignett have both contacted Shropshire Council to ensure that these vital improvements take place sooner rather than later.

A grant was given to the Pontesbury Festival committee for a significant spread in the June newsletter to promote all of the exciting activities that will take place from 27-29 June 2025.

Finally, Cllr Fletcher wished to thank Cllrs Neale Manning, Peter Heywood, Neville Lewis and Tony Mackenzie-Slight for all their hard work and commitment whilst on the parish council. In particular, Cllr Lewis, who has been on the council for decades and his knowledge and expertise, particularly as the Tree Warden, will be greatly missed.

The next Parish Council meeting will be The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council held on Monday 12th May at 7.30pm at The Pavilion. This will be the first meeting of the newly formed Parish Council following the elections on 1st May. Councillors will be asked to join the various Parish Council committees and the hard work of the next four years will begin!

The next Planning Committee meeting will be held on Monday 2nd June at 6.30pm at the Pavilion. There is not a Planning Committee meeting in May due to the elections and Bank Holiday. 

West Shropshire Flower Club

Jackie Jones demonstrated 'It's a dogs life' for our March meeting, where she depicted breeds in flowers. Her Egyptian styled arrangement for the Pharaoh hound, was a rustic display of gold and purple in a rush basket using a range of foliage with differing forms exotic forms, gold gerberas and alstroemeria and iris. We were all wondering what would come next using the blue bowl with a straw doll swathed in gingham - Toto of course! She created a magical whimsical arrangement within a framework of twigs and pussy willow, then an abundance of rainbow colours, cream stocks, massive pink gerberas, orange freesias, red alstroemeria, with pink and yellow lilies. Dalmatians were obviously a black and white affair using a plume of dyed pampus with a line of large white chrysanthemums and white roses within variegated silver foliage, and with a nod to the use of Dalmatians to calm horses around fires, red cornus and twisted ting with flame like red veronica. The sweet handtied placed within a handbag was the Chihuahua, filled with soft pink roses and alstroemeria. The Afghan hound used the national tree (pine) and national flower (tulip), along with matching orange roses. The final arrangement based on a continental cut poodle used cotton stems in a French opulence design full of glorious large pink roses, chrysanthemums and orchids.



Establishing St George's Meadow in Pontesbury Cemetery, Bogey

Lane In 2021/22, part of Pontesbury Cemetery which is not yet used for burials was set up to become a meadow. This was supported by the Stepping Stones Project and Marches Meadows Group. An information board in the cemetery explains more.

The meadow space now needs more work to help it become a place where meadow plants, insects, birds and mammals can thrive. St George's Church Eco Group is delighted that the **Shropshire Hills Conservation Fund**, run by the Shropshire Hills National Landscape, is supporting us to:

- Cut and remove grass cuttings three times in 2025/26
- Scarify the land and sow wildflower seed
- Engage with the local community through events and activities to enjoy the site and to learn about the importance of hay meadows for biodiversity

We will be working with Pontesbury Primary School on an art project for the Pontesbury Festival (27th-29th June), and there will be an open air, open-to-all church service in the meadow on Sunday 13th July at 3pm (bring a rug/chair/picnic!).

The Shropshire Hills are a National Landscape (previously known as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty). The purpose of National Landscapes is to reduce risks from climate change and nature depletion, and to improve people's wellbeing. The St George's Meadow project aims to help biodiversity in our cemetery, close to Pontesford Hill. Keep an eye on how the meadow space changes over the year! More

Who is this Mystery Man? Does

anyone know who this person is? It is believed the photograph is of Richard Samuel France (the son of Richard France who lived with his family in Plealey. Richard Samuel France died at his friend's house in 1882 (William and Maria Spaull)), at Bryntirion on Morda Road, Oswestry. This photo is still

hanging on the wall at this house! The photograph is also in a house in Bronygarth where apparently the owner's grandfather bought the property from 'a' Mr France, but we do not have the address or owners name of this house.

Millionaire Richard Samuel France owned limestone quarries in Llanymynech and coal mines at Nantmawr; as well as engineering works to produce bridges, locomotives, wagons and construction equipment for railway contractors. He was responsible for building railway lines; including, for example, the Potts line and Abbey Station in Shrewsbury in 1866. Shrewsbury Railway Heritage Trust is also trying to trace his descendants, so anyone named France is welcome to contact them. 
