They are then sorted out into all the list of "paper rounds" and inserted into the rack which is then wheeled outside the Pavilion so that the large team of deliverers (44 committed volunteers) can pick up their 'round' when it suits them.

Chris(tine) and Jonathan have been doing all the sorting every month for a number of years – they've forgotten just how many. However, they have both decided that it is time to hang up their sorting hats and retire. So, Pontesbury is looking for a team of at least 2 -3 people who would be prepared to sort out the village newsletters once a month. It is a very clearly defined role.

Pontesbury Parish Council wish to send hearty thanks to Christine and Jonathan for their dedication and reliability on sorting out the newsletters for the last however many years. Both Jonathan and Christine have agreed to sort the joint December 2024/January 2025 issue and therefore, the hope is that any new volunteers will be able to shadow the current team until they retire at the end of the calendar year – you will not be dropped in at the deep end!

The total commitment of each of the 'sorter's' would be between 2 and 2.5 hours per issue, usually during the last week of the month for 10 issues per year. This includes the hand deliveries to local shops & establishments..

Shropshire Council Matters - Pontesbury Parish area is represented by myself and Roger Evans on Shropshire Council:-

Garden waste - the new subscription service will begin on 4th November, by which date you should have received new (better quality) sticker(s) to place on green bins. The first year of paid service will run until 31st October.2025.

Recycling Centres - also from 4th November, remember to pre-book a slot if you are intending to use one of the recycling centres. All centres will remain open 7 days a week - to be reviewed in April 2025.

The Guildhall in Frankwell, is the new administrative centre for Shropshire Council following the decision,made in September to vacate Shirehall. Staff will begin moving to the new base in November. The future of the Shirehall Site has not been decided.

A new **swimming pool** is planned as part of an upgrade to the Sports Village in Sundorne. The proposed pool will be 8-lanes, 25 metres, and suitable for competitions, with seating for 250 spectators and space for 250 competitors. No decision has been made on the future of the Quarry Swimming and Fitness Centre.

Pontesbury Parish Council - met on Monday 14th October in Pontesbury Pavilion Community Hub & Library. The Council received a presentation from the National Flood Forum, and will continue to work with them to set up a public meeting, potentially in February 2025. Anyone affected by flooding and wanting support and advice about practical issues such as insurance, can ring the National Flood Forum helpline: 01299 403055.

The Local Policing Team reported on the increased patrols in antisocial hotspots such as School Green/public toilets, play area, cricket fields and Hall Bank bus shelter. The team have also been into school and spoken to parents of pupils involved. The speed camera team have also been out in the parish recording the speeds of motorists.

Grants were made to Pontesbury Sports Association and Pontesbury Festival.

The Working group set up to analyse the results of the survey made a number of recommendations which were approved by Full Council and have been sent to Shropshire Council for consideration. 

Tree planting at Pontesbury Community Orchard

Parish Council Chair, Cllr Duncan Fletcher joined members of the Mary Webb Society on 20th September for a tree-planting ceremony at the Pontesbury Community Orchard. A St Milburga's White rare crab apple tree had been kindly donated to the Society by grower Ken Milner of Much Wenlock, and keen local member Sue King just knew that the community orchard would be the ideal spot for it. The tree was expertly planted by Siobhan Reedy, who will continue to tend it. Society



secretary Anne Williams said, "We had a very happy afternoon in Pontesbury, where Mary Webb wrote The Golden Arrow while living at Rose Cottage (1914-16) and Gone to Earth at The Nills (1916-17). Mary Webb adored and was inspired by the Shropshire hill country and the people who lived there so Pontesbury is the perfect choice for our tree. We are very grateful to Siobhan and also to parish clerk Debbie Marais. They've both been enormously helpful.

Public Consultation about the further management of Pontesford Hill and Earls Hill

7-9pm, Tuesday 19th November in the Pavilion, Pontesbury. All welcome

When Pontesford Hill was gifted to Shropshire Wildlife Trust in 2016 their ecologists assessed the habitat and made a 'management prescription' to improve it. Since then SWT and the Friends of Pontesford Hill have organized weekly work parties implementing that plan.

Over the eight years there have been some unwelcome extra challenges: ash die-back disease, Storm Arwen and a changing climate. The Friends have broadened their interest to include the whole Reserve, including Earls Hill and

the meadows. We have experimented with various innovations: using scythes to control invasive scrub, leaving more dead timber as habitat, and grazing with goats rather than sheep.

NATURAL ENGLAND - Notes from the hill

The wet weather continues into the autumn and winter, has there ever been a year like it for rain? It is apt that this month's featured species from the Stepping Stones species action plans is a bird that thrives in watery environments, the dipper.


A bird of upland streams and rivers, the dipper is a uniquely adapted bird that is as much at home below the water as it is above it. The dipper has the claim to fame that it is Britain's only aquatic songbird, and this is due to a variety of adaptations such as its strong flipper like wings that allow it to swim in fast flowing water and strong claws that can grip to the slippery underwater rocks allowing it to walk along the streambed. It has extremely dense feathers which give it its plump appearance, and these are extremely well oiled from a large preen gland, which give it a silver bubble like appearance when swimming underwater. It has special flaps on its nostrils to prevent water entering when it dives, and it can alter the shape of the lenses in its eyes to focus above and below the

water. Finally, it also has very high levels of red blood cells which stores lots of oxygen in its blood to allow it to dive for long periods.

Dippers were chosen by the stepping Stones as a key species in this area because they are indicators of clean waters in our upland rivers. They feed for the most part on caddis and mayfly nymphs which only live in clean, well oxygenated rivers. Pollution and sediment load are key threats to dippers, as can be acidification from large scale conifer planting, but nesting sites are also important and locally there has been some success in putting up nest boxes for dippers. Although dippers are not found on the Stiperstones, some of our actions to slow the flow of water coming off the hill should help reduce high rates of flow which can damage nest sites and reduce low flows which can prevent the birds from feeding.

Back on the Stiperstones we have a new reserve ranger, Anna starting in November, and we are also working with Leeds Beckett University on a project looking at recreational impact on nature reserves. Sam, who is also starting soon, will be working with us on the latter project and will be trialling amongst other things different forms of signage around the site. His main focus will be on the effects of the increasing use of mountain bikes on sites such as the Stiperstones, so he will be particularly interested in talking to any local bikers.


