Along the journey, as well as encouragement from the adults, the children were supporting one another and it was lovely to hear shouts of, 'Keep Going!' and 'Aim High, Climb Higher!' which is our school motto.

Myles is one of our students and he has reduced mobility, he uses a state-of-the-art wheelchair for longer journeys which his family have raised money for. We gave it a 'proper' road test and between Andy (Myles' dad), Myles and myself, we got to the summit to be met by applause and cheers of 'Well done Myles.' He was overjoyed to reach the top!

It was an achievement for all of our school and I think it showed Myles and all of the children that anything is possible if you set to your mind to it and have the right support behind you.

My thanks go to all of the staff and volunteers for making this happen and helping the children 'Aim High, Climb Higher.' We truly have a wonderful school community.

#### **Pontesbury Parish Council**

At the October meeting councillors approved a grant to the Parish Paths Partnership (P3) group for new tools and equipment for their work around the parish. Councillors thanked the group for all the hard work they do keeping local paths clear and accessible.

Councillors were pleased to hear that the re-siting of the litter bin outside the bus shelter at the top of Hall Bank has been well received and is helping the littering problem in and around the bus shelter. Councillors also approved the replacement of the damaged BMX sign at the play area and to put a sign up on School Green to deter football in that area which has been disturbing local residents.

The Licence to Occupy for Pontesbury Library within the Pavilion, between Shropshire Council Library Service and Pontesbury Parish Council, has been signed for a further 3 years which gives great continuity for such a valued and well-used community service.

Councillors from Pontesbury, Minsterley and Hanwood parish councils are working together with members of Pontesbury Climate Emergency Action Group to encourage nature recovery by working as a cluster of parish councils. On 3rd October Pontesbury Parish Clerk and Cllr Wallace Johnson spoke at a conference about nature recovery, held in Ellesmere, about the value of working in partnership to increase the impact of local activities on increasing biodiversity in the Rea Valley area. The parish cluster is called Rea-act for Nature. There are talks and various community activities planned, so watch this space. Below is an article about a biodiversity event on 6th December, 2-3.30pm at The Pavilion, and about developing a dead hedge for insects. Wondering what to do with all of those leaves landing in your garden? Why not build a dead hedge.

It might sound odd, but a dead hedge is a wonderful habitat that's full of life and a wonderful addition to your garden, playground or other outdoor space!! Dead hedges full of dead trees, shrubs and other garden waste, provide hiding places and nesting habitats for all sorts of creatures, food for insects and they are great for fungi. They mimic the practical benefits of a fence, whilst providing all the natural goodness of deadwood. 



This powerful one-man show brings to life the final 15 months of Wilfred Owen – the renowned war poet born in Oswestry, Shropshire. From his time at Craiglockhart Hospital being treated for shell-shock, to his influential friendship with Siegfried Sassoon and the poetic brilliance it inspired, the story follows Owen's return to the Western Front and his untimely death just days before the Armistice.

Owen's story is one of hidden strength, fragility and the tragic cutting-short of huge potential. This first-person perspective is alive with language and wry humour, bringing to life his thoughts and inspirations.

#### Ask the Animal Healer - Rebecca Rea

Therapeutic help for animals and their people

#### Fireworks

Have you got a stressed, nervous dog, cat, horse? don't suffer alone, ask the animal healer.

Whether it is fireworks, traffic, separation anxiety etc there are emergency calmers and longer-term solutions to help a pet that is suffering.

Firework week is particularly frightening for very many animals, pets and wildlife. It is no different to a gun going off, and I have seen the most heartbreaking responses, even dogs trying to climb out of windows in desperation, or shaking uncontrollably on the ground unable to move. Even people with PTSD can be affected.

Plan ahead, the quicker you help your pet the more successful it will be - you can buy some emergency calming aids from pet shops, ask your Vet if they can help, or get Animal Bach flower Rescue Remedy or Helios SOeSsence Flower Formula www.helios.co.uk (01892 537254).

Thunder Shirts are also a great help for dogs and can be bought at Pets at home or online, www.thundershirt.com.

Longer-term solutions I have seen successful outcomes with include pet CBD oil for dogs, cats and horses as well as homeopathic treatment. Also always ensure your pet has a safe familiar space in the home or their paddock where they can retreat to. Play soothing music and keep calm yourself, offering them your support.

There are also techniques and training you can learn to do with your animal companion to grow their resilience to stress and fears so that they and you have a calmer, happier life.

Remember, if they are reacting they need help and understanding. I can support you in that if you wish. I work on a donation basis only.

The Shropshire Hills

Conservation Fund has reopened this autumn and new applications are invited for projects to start in spring 2026.

#### Fund priorities are:

- Conserving and enhancing the natural beauty, landscape, wildlife or heritage of the Shropshire Hills National Landscape.
- Educational and awareness-raising activities relating to the area and its conservation, especially involving young people.

We're keen to encourage applications from community groups. Grants are in the range of £500 -£2,000 and can make a real difference in converting great ideas into sustainable community action for nature and people.

If you have an idea in mind, the first step is to complete a short project idea form. We will then get in touch with you to discuss your idea and will be able to recommend whether your project should progress to full application. The deadline to make an expression of interest to the Fund is 13th February 2026.





#### NATURAL ENGLAND Notes from the hill

Although the summer seems to have been drawn out rather late this year the hill is showing signs of autumn and by the time you read this will probably be showing all the autumn colours in the bilberry, the bracken and the trees. This is always the best time of the year for fungi and this year seems to be a bumper year.

Fungi, which most people know as mushrooms and toadstools, come in a vast variety of colours and forms and are a vitally important part of life on earth. Although they often go unnoticed, hidden below ground or within rotting wood, they

are essential to ecosystems and to human health. Fungi are the worlds natural recycling system, breaking down dead organic matter and releasing nutrients into the soil essential to plant growth and all animals that rely upon it. Their underground mycorrhizae also play a vital part in the absorption of nutrients and water by plants and of course we use fungi for a variety of purposes. After all what would we do without the yeast that makes our bread rise and our beer brew.

Woodlands are often the places where you would go to see mushrooms and toadstools and the birch woodlands on the Stiperstones are home to one of the most recognised toadstools, the fly agaric. With its white speckled red cap, it is the toadstool in every fairy story. Its name refers to a traditional use of the dried flesh being sprinkled in milk to kill insects.

Most of our mushrooms and toadstools now have common names, many of which are quite descriptive such as jelly ear, rancid bonnet, hairy curtain crust and wood cauliflower.

The Stiperstones has some great fungi records not only from its woodlands but also in other habitats such as the scrub and its grasslands.

We have records of two particularly notable fungi that have been found on the grasslands of the Stiperstones. The big blue pinkgill is a rare toadstool which we thought would be relatively easy to identify as there aren't many blue fungi in the Uk, however it has now been split into four distinct species, so who knows which one we have. The olive earthtongue is another rare fungi that also may be a complex of different species. This is a tiny green or brown fungus that as the name suggests emerges from the ground with tongue shaped fruiting bodies. Both are found on old unimproved pastures.
