Also inside was a wonderful display of Apple varieties from Peter and Alice's Orchard in Minsterley.





SHROPSHIRE COUNCILLOR REPORT SEPT 2025 Finances-latest figures show that the Council is projecting an overspend of £35.169 million by the end of the 2025/2026 financial year. That is £889,000 above the present financial resources available. Please note that this is a "projected" figure, based on expected increases in costs, as well as savings not achieved in previous years. Legally, this is not allowed, so unless action is taken to balance the books, a section 114 notice will be served on the Council. This will effectively pass over control of the whole Council to Government-appointed Commissioners, resulting in dramatic cuts to services.

Shropshire Council Cabinet declared a "Financial Emergency" when it met on 10th September. With immediate effect, staff have been instructed to stop all non-essential spending. All essential spending will be vigorously challenged by Team Leaders and Budget Holders, without exception. Shropshire Council is one of many Councils across the country facing a financial emergency - mainly due to a year-on-year decrease in Government funding and soaring costs, particularly in Social Care, which accounts for nearly 80% of Shropshire Council's annual budget.

DEVOLUTION - Within the next decade Shropshire Councils' intention is to focus solely on delivering statutory services, with all other responsibilities devolved to Town and Parish Councils. Pilot schemes are expected to begin next year, starting with the StreetScene service. A memorandum of understanding has been sent to all 153 Parish Councils. Whilst this is not legally binding, it is the first step in enabling Town and Parish Councils to undertake certain types of local work, in partnership with Shropshire Council Officers.

HOPE VALLEY—Members will be pleased to hear that the major works needed to stabilise sections of the A488 up Hope Valley have just been completed. There is some white–lining to be completed shortly, but the road is now fully open to all traffic.

For our new Reception children, we have helped them find their way around school, learn new routines and settle into school life. 

Ask the Animal Healer - Rebecca Rea

Therapeutic help for animals and their people

A day in the life of an Animal Healer-

Horses, cats, dogs, rabbits ... even a possum once! My work is incredibly varied: e.g. one minute offering complementary therapies to reduce pain, stress, digestive problems or enhance recovery from illness, the next re-arranging furniture with someone to help a blind, arthritic or nervous animal. I may be doing some behaviour training, using animal communication abilities, or giving energy healing to a distressed rescue animal or one with dementia etc, or carrying out dietary research and writing up a plan for a way forward.

But one thing for sure is it always involves supporting people to grow a deeper understanding and relationship with their animal.

This morning got off to a fun start online, courtesy of a very enthusiastic farmer's wife from Wales who wants to do some learning with me and develop her own abilities to help animals. She is upset by the cruelty to animals that she sees in the world and wants to do something about it – even though her friends think she is silly to believe in such things. So teaching and mentoring is also part of my work.

And to this afternoon, I sit writing this for our local newsletter in the hope that I can make a little more difference to an animal's life and their owners'. I work on a donation basis so no animal goes unheard.

NATURAL ENGLAND - Notes from the hill One species that you might expect to do well in the sunshine is the wood ant which build their nests or solariums so as to maximise catching the warmth of the sun. However, the wood ants that we are lucky enough to have within our upland woodlands are a northern species called hairy wood ants. They are on the southern edge of their range, so in the peak of the summer this year there was little activity on their nest mounds as they had retreated to the shade underground. At least half of their nest is usually underground, which like in our houses have various rooms or chambers for different purposes.




Across Europe, wood ants are under threat, and many species ranges are shrinking. Some of the main reasons for this decline are: changes in woodland management, woodland fragmentation, urban expansion, and human disturbance.

Our population of hairy wood ants at Resting Hill seem quite isolated, but it would be good to hear if anyone knows of any wood ant nests in the surrounding area as that would inform us of how best to link up some of their sites. Are there any in Snailbeach or Eastridge for example?






