Pontesbury Parish Council The Parish Council meeting in July was held at Habberley Village Hall and three new councillors were co-opted onto the council. Ken Day for Pontesbury ward, Louise Jones for Cruckton ward and Graham Moss for Plealey ward. All come with a great deal of experience from working in the fire service, NHS and running a planning consultancy. A big welcome to the team.

The council approved the purchase of a new basket swing for the play area to replace the current wooden one and to set up a task and finish group to draw up an action plan and consult with residents about replacing some of the other equipment in the coming months.

The council also adopted a new health and safety policy covering all aspects of the council's service provision and a tree management policy for the many trees that the council is responsible for.

Councillors addressed a number of concerns raised by residents about the speed of traffic entering the village from Habberley and Polesgate.

Community Orchard

A big thank you to Siobhan, Phil, Bill, Sandy, Dave and Jack for all their help with watering



the trees in the community orchard during this very dry spell. Even though the trees are quite large now they were showing signs of distress. This focussed watering should mean that by next summer they will have established enough to survive further dry weather.

West Shropshire Flower Club The club were once again lucky enough to have Sionedd Hughs to entertain us with her 'It's a wonderful world', literally demonstrating what she thinks is wonderful. Throughout the demonstration we were treated to anecdotes and stories which kept everyone amused. She started with a walk by demonstrating the new 'meadow' style, characterised by placement of plant material which is less dense (lavender, larkspur, mint, helenium and sunflowers) at the top, becoming denser at the base, resulting in a wonderful slightly see-through layered natural result. Her under-sea scene depicting her (pipe)dream to go scuba diving and see what is in the ocean, was a wonder of rusts, corals and purples, arranged around tall linear central structures including sprayed loofa and an array of foliage textures and shapes. To demonstrate a novel and sustainable way of creating a hand tied bouquet, she had made wire framework into which she placed florets of tied honeycomb packing paper to create space and support for her focal flowers of stocks, sedum and coffee coloured chrysanthemums with ammi for softness. The next thing that gave her delight was NAFAS and the opportunity to play with flowers, a wild and flowing design with lilies placed low in a variety of foliage showing line, colour and design. She had recently undertaken a course for judging flower competitions, in which she covered floral history including Dutch still life and paintings of flower arrangements, explaining the wonders of the paintings. Her pedestal design covered all the main aspects of the paintings with a rich mixture of many types of flowers and colours and, as the painters did, using spring summer and autumn flowers, larkspur, roses, gerberas, lilies and chrysanthemums. She topped things off giving delight to the audience with her thrill of the natural world and the wonders of tree canopy. Using a framework of contorted hazel raised high on clear legs and dressed with nodding clematis and wonderful pink spray roses to give a light airy magical design.



Ask the Animal Healer - Rebecca Rea

Therapeutic help for animals and their people

How stress and fear cause reactivity

Animals experience stress and trauma like we do. They react to fear, trauma or overwhelm by instinctually going into fight, flight, freeze or appease mode. These reactions are natural and are controlled by the brain's Hypothalamus gland. Reactions can lead to quiet withdrawal, aggression, running away, dependency, being frenetic, being vocal etc.


While most people are very upset seeing their animal in distress, some sadly respond with reactive anger feeling out of control themselves. But it is really important to understand that the animal is not wilfully being difficult, they are purely trying to survive in that moment. Change is possible through compassion and understanding.

In a safe healthy animal or person the Hypothalamus responsible for stress reactions, hormones, digestion, sleep, emotions will reset itself after the initial fear, but in those facing prolonged stress or repeating encounters with things or people similar to the original trauma (triggers), it can sadly become stuck. Like us, the animal can be left with PTSD and long-term neurological and nervous system damage. This impairs the ability to regulate behaviour and emotional impulses making it difficult to relate and often resulting in pain and a wide range of health problems even many years down the line.

But the good news is that these issues can often be greatly improved with the right understanding.




